Dewberry - *The Spirit of Country* - is situated at the junction of the recently paved Highway # 45 and Highway #893, linking to Highway #41 to the west and Highway #16 to the south. The Village is located 250 kilometers east of Edmonton, and is also, in the center of and within short commuting distance to Elk Point, Vermilion and Lloydminster.

The first settlers came to the district in 1906 and the Village was incorporated in 1957. Dewberry is named after the abundance of “dewberries” found in the area in earlier years.

Dewberry is fortunate to be located in a prime agricultural area with heavy oil activity, both of which provide employment opportunities. Dewberry is also fortunate to have a varied business sector in the Village to meet the needs of the residents and surrounding communities. Several service organizations and churches are active in the Village, with the Dewberry Valley Museum being a highlight for tourists.
